WHITE CARD TRAINING OPPORTUNITY

'White Card' is a term used to describe the plastic card issued by a Registered Training Organisation indicating that a person has undertaken general induction training for construction work. Under the Work Health Safety legislation, workers on construction sites in Australia must undertake general induction training or 'White Card training' and have evidence of their attendance from the course before they are permitted to commence work on a construction site. The Work Health Safety regulations outline this requirement.

Waikerie High School students (Years 10-12) will have the opportunity to gain their White Card qualifications on Wednesday, May 4th (Week 1, Term2). There is a sign-up sheet for students outside of my office. Alternatively please contact me at school, or email lauren.oswald558@schools.sa.edu.au to find out more information. The cost of the course will be \$50 (will confirm) and will commence at 9am after home group. Students will be invoiced and must also fill in a green slip to ensure they know what work they are missing in their classes on that day.

2016 ABORIGINAL CULTURAL AND EDUCATIONAL CAMP

Recently a group of 16 of our Indigenous Students ranging from Years 8 to 12 attended a three day Cultural and Educational Camp in and around the Adelaide District. This camp was to promote their ancestral culture as well as to increase their knowledge and understanding of traditional practices and foods and to discover future options for further education.

The experiences that the students encountered included a visit to Tauondi College and Flinders University, Warriparinga/Kaurna Cultural Education Centre, the Tjilbruke Monument at Brighton Beach and the historical Colebrook Home Memorial Reconciliation Park where Mrs Dutschke and Samuel Twilley placed some native flowers at the monument.

We also visited and toured the Port Adelaide Football Club where members from the Power Community Mentoring Program Paul Van der Berg, Wade Thompson (former AFL Port Power player) and Robbie Young (current Port Adelaide Magpies player) made time to talk to the students about striving to be the best that they can be. During the visit students also had the opportunity to meet former Magpie great Russel Ebert and a number of current Port Power players including current captain Travis Boak.

Students were also given some time to enjoy recreational activities while staying at the camp site and were also treated to an all you can eat pizza meal.

The final day of the camp was spent at the Mega Adventure Park where everyone got to try out the 26 metre high structure with 50 aerial crossings. Mr Stevens was one of the last to hop off as he was enjoying it so much. Mrs Dutschke was too busy taking Photos.

It was a very quiet trip on the way home. Arriving back at school to enjoy a family BBQ kindly prepared and cooked by Mrs Maywald and Mr McLaren.

According to feedback from the students, Colebrook Memorial Reconciliation Park and the Mega Adventure Park were the highlights of the camp.

The school would like to thank the Waikerie Rotary Club for their generous donation without their help a lot of the activities would not have been

possible. In the near future two of our students will be attending a Rotary Dinner to talk about their experience.
