## Summary of key policies and procedures.

<b>LATE ARRIVALS</b>	If a student is arriving late with parent consent they <b>MUST</b> have a note in their diary explaining the lateness.
<b>AND EARLY DEPARTURE</b>	If a student needs to leave early they <b>MUST</b> have a diary note which they show to their home group teacher (HG teacher will initial it). The student must show it to the subject teacher when they need to leave and then show it to the admin staff in the front office as they sign out.
<b>MOBILE PHONE</b> <b>SMART DEVICES</b> <b>LAP TOPS</b>	No student is permitted to use a mobile phone at any part of the school day whilst on school grounds. Inappropriate use of smart devices is prohibited. Using a mobile phone to create a personal hotspot that bypasses the school network is prohibited. Parents / Caregivers who need to contact their child during the school day are expected to do so by phoning the Front Office on 85412533. Likewise, students are expected to use the Front Office to contact their parents if a need arises  Students not following this procedure will be required to place the phone/device in an envelope that is collected from the front office by a parent/caregiver.
<b>YEAR 12 HOME STUDY</b>	Year 12 students must present home study cards or a note to the front office when arriving. Students without cards must sign in unexplained. Students are not permitted to leave without cards or a signed note from Mr Valentine.
<b>UNIFORM</b>	We are very proud of our school uniform and they look fantastic on the students. It was very pleasing to see all student in uniform at the start of the year. Reminder we have new skirts for the girls. These are <b>NOT</b> to be hemmed up to ensure our skirt length is adhered to within the uniform policy.

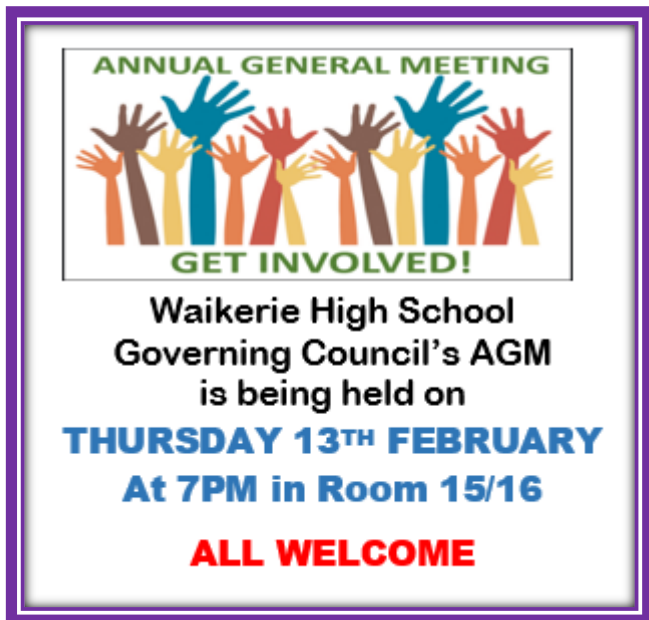

### 1:1 Device – Student Personal Computer



Most students have brought their laptops to school and successfully connected them to the school system. This is encouraging as it will support students in the learning at school and home.

For those that have yet to acquire a laptop, the Edunet portal is still open for purchases. To enter the Edunet site go to [waikerie.technologyportal.com.au](http://waikerie.technologyportal.com.au) and use the access code **whs2019**. The Lenovo ThinkPad 11e Yoga 5th Gen is the recommended model. Once in the Edunet parent portal, follow the procedure to set up an account, a device, accessories and insurance can then be selected. There are a number of different payment options that can be chosen. Once the device is paid for, Edunet will deliver the device to the address specified in the order. Edunet has a support centre with service technicians to assist with any problems that may arise. They also have a professional vendor relationship with the school to ensure that parents are supported through the selecting, ordering, payment and delivery of the device to the student.

### **IMMUNISATION FOR PARENTS OF YEAR 8 STUDENTS**

The SA School Immunisation Program will be offered at Waikerie High School by the District Council of Loxton Waikerie.

All 2020 Year 8 students will be offered:

2 doses of human papillomavirus vaccine, (Gardasil®9) at 2 separate visits.

1 dose of the Boostrix® vaccine – diphtheria, tetanus, whooping cough.

Immunisation consent packs will be sent home with all Year 8 students. It is important that you read the information contained in the packs before you give consent for your child to be vaccinated at school. If you have any questions about this program, please contact the District Council of Loxton Waikerie on 8584 8000 or the SA Health Immunisation Section on 1300 232 272.

All parents / legal guardians are required to complete, sign and return the Consent Cards, even if you do not consent for the student to be vaccinated at school.

If you do not want your child to be vaccinated at school, you can arrange to go to your local medical clinic for the vaccination, they will need to order the vaccine in and may charge a consultation fee.

Remember to keep your child's School Immunisation Program records in a safe place as they may be required for future employment or travel.

Forms need to be returned by 19/02/2020 ready for immunisation day on 28/02/2020.

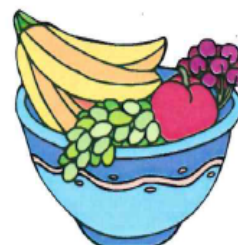
