WHATS HAPPENED IN AGRICULTURE IN TERM 3

Year 11 and 12

The senior class has now been combined and are co-ordinating the Ewes and Lambs while the Year 11 focus on what makes a good show Silkie with the hope of being able to selectively breed for the required traits (Mrs Haynes would be proud we are using genetics!!).























Year 10

Students continue to work with the show merinos by walking, weighing and feeding. They are questioned on aspects of sheep husbandry, nutrition, the industry and performing general health checks. Six dedicated and lucky students will compete against 36 other schools and 68 teams of 3 wethers at the Schools Merino Competition held at the Royal Adelaide Agricultural Show Grounds on the 8th and 9th September.

Our pig's eco shelter is maintained for cleanliness (a tough ask some days), while pigs are weighed and more health checks conducted, all while the pigs try to nibble at the students toes. Funny to watch the students reactions.

We maintain our trial citrus crops where Valencia oranges are grown on four different root stocks (Tri, Tanghe, Ghana and Zao). Students measure height, health, pest and disease, trunk girth (circumference), fruit size, number and quality under the guidance of Dr Tahir Khurshid, Research Physiologist for the Department of Primary Industries NSW.

In addition to all of this, they have now planted most of the horticulture plot and pruned the fruit trees in the Ag plots. Lots of hands on stuff and blisters to boot!!























Year 9

Students will be working with poultry this term and continuing growing veggies for the school and community. They have been introduced to our chooks and there is hope that we will have some new additions once the eggs hatch a little later this term. New Buff Laced and Barred Wyandottes as well as Silkies which will go into a breeding program, conducted by the Yr 11s, so that the yr 9s can hopefully show them at the Royal Adelaide Agricultural Show next year. Next term Yabbies will be investigated (life cycle, maintenance, nutrition, welfare and breeding). Fun Fun Fun!!

It has finally begun. Pad is down, holes drilled and posts are in. Can't wait to start propagating plants. A huge thanks to Tammy Atze for donating thousands of Salt Bush seeds for our sheep. They will be the first things grown. Thanks to Andrew Linke and Roger Perks for helping to erect the posts.











Periods, Pain and Endometriosis School Program (PPEP Talk)

Week 5 Clinical Educator Michelle Nielsen spoke to the Year 9 girls as part of the extended learning program about periods, pain and endometriosis. Year 9 boys also had the opportunity to learn about PPEP and have a chat about the topic in EL as part as the Shine SA program.

Since starting the program in May 2019, PPEP Talk results have been outstanding with 91.67% of students saying PPEP Talk taught them things about the human body they didn't know, and 90.27% of students found the PPEP Talk enjoyable and informative.

Results have shown that 59.88% of students are reporting 3 or more days of pelvic pain or discomfort of any kind, even mild pain, over an average month. While 22.58% are experiencing between 6-30 days of pelvic pain. This type of pain is common but is not normal, and it is clear that there is a need for more education around periods, pelvic pain and endometriosis in schools.
