#### PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

#### Dear Parents.

We have come to the end of another extremely busy term. As usual, this newsletter we share some of the many learning activities and events. Our front cover highlights exciting work in our Agriculture Learning Centre. Congratulations to the students, parents and staff involved.

#### **School Reports**

Reports are available on DayMap and provide valuable feedback for the term. It is a good opportunity to sit down with your child and their report and reflect on their learning progress. As with the Traffic Lights sent home in Week 5, reflecting on successes and areas of improvement is a process every student should do before re-setting goals for next term.

#### Parent Student Teacher Interviews – online booking system

An important part of this reflection and goal setting is our Parent, Student, Teacher Interviews which are to be held in the school Hall on Thursday 14<sup>th</sup> October between 2:45pm and 6:15pm. #### **Celebration of Success Assembly**

Next term, Week 1, Friday 15<sup>th</sup> October we will hold our Term 3 Academic Awards Ceremony in the hall starting at 10:45 am and concluding at 11:15am. Students receiving awards will be notified today (Friday) via email. We encourage parents and caregivers to attend to help celebrate student achievements.

#### **NAPLAN**

We were very proud of our Year 9 students with their efforts and results. It is so rewarding to see the two goals of improving writing and numeracy in our Site Improvement Plan being achieved over the last three years. This year, numeracy growth (improvement) in NAPLAN testing went from a 6.44 average (Year 7) to 7.43 average. Out of all NAPLAN tests, writing had greatest growth of 5.81 average (Year 7) to 7.07 average. Congratulations to all Year 9 students.

#### **Progressive Achievement Tests (PAT)**

Students complete PAT tests in reading and writing from Years 3 to 10. We recently conducted the testing and it was fantastic to see our students displaying our learner dispositions of self-motivation and grit. They should be proud of their efforts. We look forward to the results and anticipate good progression for many of our students.

#### **Year 7 Transition Visits**

It has been a pleasure to have our future Year 7 and 8 students visit us this week. Year 6 and 7 students from each of the Primary Schools have had the opportunity to meet new peers and are now more familiar with the high school.

#### **Buildings and grounds**

We continue to improve our learning environment and it is fantastic to now have the renovations of old computing rooms (35/36) converted into a modern open space for our senior students to attend home group and for private study. Major works are starting during the holidays with the replacement of worn underground piping. We will also have new surfaces to replace the worn bitumen. This will continue into Term 4. We look forward to this next phase of our grounds improvement.

#### **Staffing**

Judy Stevens has announced her retirement and will finish this term. Judy has been at Waikrie High School since 2011 and has worked as an SSO in reception and administration. She started with the Department in 1986 and has contributed so much for the students, staff and families during this time. We thank her for all the support she has provided and wish her the very best for the next chapter in her life. We welcome Stavroula Milonas who will be replacing Judy.

#### **ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL SENIOR SCHOOL**

#### **Subject Selection**

Thank you for the great response from students and parents/caregivers during subject selection. Interviews were conducted during the term for current Year 10 and 11 students and the school values the discussion with parents about student pathways.

Current Year 8 and 9 students have also completed their selections online. As a result of these selections, the school now works on timetabling and staffing for 2022.

#### Year 11 (Stage 1 SACE)

Week 7 of Term 4 (22<sup>nd</sup> to 26<sup>th</sup> November) will be Year 11 Exam week. Students will attend exams only during this week unless instructed to attend lessons by their teacher.

Students who are not up to date with Research Project, English and/or Mathematics will be asked to attend school in Week 8 and 9 until completed. As these are compulsory SACE subjects, students cannot commence Year 12 if these subjects are incomplete.

#### Year 12 (Stage 2 SACE)

A very important few weeks for Year 12s at the start of next term. Students will officially attend in Weeks 1 and 2. Teachers will run exam revision sessions in Week 3 and the exams will be in Weeks 4 and 5.

Parents and family are invited to the Year 12 breakfast and farewell assembly on Friday 22<sup>nd</sup> October. The breakfast will start at 8:30am, Farewell assembly at 9:15am-10:00am and then students are expected to leave the school grounds after this (experience has taught us that Year 12s are in no mood for learning after this time).

Attached to the newsletter is the SACE exam timetable and Year 12 holiday revision sessions timetable.

#### **NAPLAN**

Student NAPLAN results were sent home during Week 9. It was great to see the positive attitudes that the students had leading up to and during the testing period. This has led to some great achievements in the students results. Most students had growth from their previous NAPLAN results in Year 7 and most students met the National Minimum Standards.

#### **COVID 19 Vaccinations**

During Term 4 the Waikerie Medical Centre will be running Covid Vaccination Clinics at Waikerie High School for the students. Vaccination forms have been sent home with the students this term and must be filled in and taken to your child's appointment time. If your child did not receive a form, they can collect one from the front office. Dates of the clinic are listed below. These dates are based on other immunisations for Year 8 and 10 students, other school-based activities and the availability of the Waikerie Medical Centre in Term 4. Please ring the Waikerie Medical Centre on 85413500 to make a booking time for your child during these sessions. Students in Year 12 are encouraged to make appointments with the Waikerie Medical Centre as the current date range will interfere with exams. Any student can book into the Waikerie Medical Centre for their

Covid Vaccinations but if they are under the age of 16, they must be accompanied by an adult with paper work completed prior to receiving the vaccination. A reminder that students cannot receive a Covid vaccination if they have had any other vaccinations 7 days prior. Please note that after the first Covid Vaccination dose it is important that the second dose is taken exactly 21 days later.

#### **MRS LIEBICH YEAR 9 SCIENCE**

At Waikerie High School we are lucky enough to live in a diverse and healthy river ecology. As a result, our Year 9 science classes have been learning about ecosystems through excursions to the river.

Students have recorded flora and fauna numbers, tested for water and soil quality and gathered data on both the river and flood plain ecology. Below are some pictures of our student ecologists in action.

Food webs were complex and detailed and students learn about the many adaptions organisms made to surving in a River environment.



# Parent Update Week 10, Term 3 - 2021

#### Enrolled and ready for 2022

By now, families of our current year 6 and 7 students should have received their enrolment offers for secondary school for next year. If you have not done so, please contact your child's primary school.

The next step is to accept the offer by completing and submitting the enrolment form to the secondary school.

So what happens beyond enrolment? And what can you do to support your child's transition from primary to high school?

#### Your high school will take it from here

Once you have accepted the enrolment offer your high school will provide you with information about what to expect next year.

Our schools set their own policies on things like uniforms, curriculum resources needed, school fees and mobile phone use.

They also run their own transition programs to help students settle in. Your school will keep you informed about what it has planned. Many secondary schools offer open nights or 'Bring your own device' evenings for students and their families in term 4. Events like this allow you to come into the school, meet some teachers and ask questions.

Of course, there is the possibility some of these events may be impacted by COVID restrictions. If this is the case, your school will find other ways of communicating with you and making sure your child feels welcome.

If you do attend a school event, COVID restrictions may apply, but there will be clear information to follow. This may include using the COVID-SAfe check-in each time you enter the site, wearing a face mask and practicing physical distancing.

Keep an eye out for emails and letters from your high school. You may also like to check their website and follow them on Facebook if they have an account.







#### Attend transition days

All public high schools will offer transition days to students. They generally occur during term 4. Transition days are fun days that involve school tours, activities and games to help students meet some of their new school friends and teachers. They also help students to become more familiar with the school grounds.

Feedback from our year 7 to high school pilot program showed students enjoyed their transition days and felt more confident about high school after attending them.

As a parent or carer, you can speak positively to your child about transition days and ensure they take part in them.

#### Start thinking about transport

Adelaide Metro is getting a new fleet of school buses to cater for the extra demand resulting from the year 7 to high school move.

Other school bus services also operate in our regions.

Adelaide Metro timetables for 2022 will be available later in the year, but you might like to start talking to your child about how they will get to and from high school next year.

#### Get involved as a parent

As a parent, you may be wondering how you can connect and have some involvement in your child's high school community. There are many ways of doing so.

Start by attending any 'getting to know you' events on offer, noting that they may be held early next year. If attending a school site, please ensure that COVID restrictions are always adhered to.

You may like to nominate for the school's governing council in 2022 or attend governing council meetings as an observer.


