Staff continue this work in their programming and planning in curriculum delivery and strive to continually improve student pathways and outcomes.

## SUMMARY OF KEY POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

<b>LATE ARRIVALS &amp; EARLY DEPARTURE</b>	<p>If a student is arriving late with parent consent they <b>MUST</b> have a note in their diary explaining the lateness.</p> <p>If a student needs to leave early they <b>MUST</b> have a diary note which they show to their home group teacher (HG teacher will initial it). The student must show it to the subject teacher when they need to leave and then show it to the admin staff in the front office as they sign out.</p>
<b>MOBILE PHONE</b>  <b>SMART DEVICES</b>  <b>LAP TOPS</b>	<p>No student is permitted to use a mobile phone at any part of the school day whilst on school grounds.</p> <p>Inappropriate use of smart devices is prohibited.</p> <p>Using a mobile phone to create a personal hotspot that bypasses the school network is prohibited.</p> <p>Parents / Caregivers who need to contact their child during the school day are expected to do so by phoning the Front Office on 85412533. Students are expected to use the Front Office to contact their parents if a need arises</p> <p>Students not following this procedure will be required to place the phone/device in an envelope that is collected from the front office by a parent/caregiver.</p>
<b>YEAR 12 HOME STUDY</b>	<p>Year 12 students must present home study cards to the front office when arriving. Students without cards must sign in unexplained. Students are not permitted to leave without cards or a signed note from Mr Valentine. (No home study for the first 2 weeks)</p>
<b>UNIFORM</b>	<p>We are very proud of our school uniform and they look fantastic on the students. It was very pleasing to see all student in uniform at the start of the year. Reminder we have new skirts for the girls. These are <b>NOT</b> to be hemmed up to ensure our skirt length is adhered to within the uniform policy.</p>

## ASSISTANT PRINCIPAL SENIOR SCHOOL

### SACE – South Australian Certificate of Education

#### **Year 10**

The journey begins for Yr. 10 students with their first Stage 1 subjects; the compulsory Personal Learning Plan (PLP) and optional subjects being run in Extended Home group on Friday morning which include: Scientific Studies, Digital Technologies, Information Processing & Publishing and Cross Disciplinary Studies (Fitness & Nutrition).

#### **Year 11**

All students have commence compulsory Stage 1 subjects of English and Mathematics as well as a wide range of optional subjects. Approximately half of our Year 11 cohort are also participating in Vocational Education & Training (VET) on Thursdays which will allow them to complete Certificate 2 or 3.

#### **Year 12**

The final year! Student programs are very diverse to cater for future pathways. There are students with 4 or 5 Stage 2 subjects at school wishing to achieve an Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank to get into University; students with 3 or 4 subjects at school and a day of VET with similar ambitions of university, further study or direct entry into work; students with 2 or 3 subjects with trade school and fixed work placements as part of their Australian School Based Apprenticeships (ASBA).

#### **SACE Flexibility**

With such an interrupted start to the year and with some students contracting Covid-19 and/or isolating, our teachers will remain flexible with SACE assessment. Teachers are conscious that learning has been interrupted some and have adjusted learning plans to cater. If your child is struggling to complete assessed work, please encourage them to make contact with their teacher to negotiate adjustments.

It has been a tricky start to the school year and I thank students and parents for their patience and support during this time.

## **NAPLAN 2022 Information – Year 7 and 9 Students**

This year's assessments will be done online. A Coordinated Practice Test (CTP) will be held in Term 1 on the Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> March. NAPLAN Online Testing will occur between 11<sup>th</sup> and 16<sup>th</sup> May 2022.

This year our school will join other schools across Australia in online testing for NAPLAN.

NAPLAN Online will give your child a more personalised learning experience through a 'tailored testing' approach. Tailored testing means students are given questions that suit their ability, providing a better assessment and more accurate results.

Attached to this newsletter is a 'NAPLAN Online - information for parents and carers' information sheet with more information on NAPLAN or you can access the information on the following URL link: <https://nap.edu.au/naplan/parent-carer-support>

A student privacy notice is also attached. Student information has always been captured during the NAPLAN testing process. The move to NAPLAN Online means student details will be uploaded into the Online National Assessment Platform, managed by Education Services Australia (ESA) on behalf of the state and Australian governments.

### Sports Day Expectations:

### Instructions for all students

1. Dress in house colours ready to compete. Wear appropriate footwear and wear a hat for when you are not competing.
2. Arrive before 8:40am and sign in at the desks outside the Recreation Centre
  - a. The school is open during the day; if you are late (after 10:00am) you must sign in at school with a parent or signed note.
  - b. If you are planning on an early departure, you are required to have a parent present, signed note from your HG teacher and must sign out at the front office.
3. Bus students will walk through the school's tennis courts, use the crossing lights and avoid walking through the car park at the rec. centre.
4. Report to your House Captain and cheer on your house mates if not in a morning event.
5. During the day compete, volunteer and spectate.

All students are to attend the day. There is something for everybody: track and field events and ball games are offered. Those students not competing can earn points for their house by assisting with the running of the day. The more volunteers we have, the smoother the day runs. Please let your house captain know if you can assist.

Marion Maywald will run the canteen in the clubrooms so plenty of food and drink will be available. Sunscreen and drinking water will be provided at the finish line.

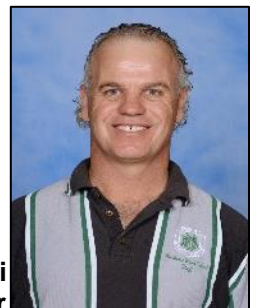






### Year 9 Agriculture

## NAPLAN – privacy collection notice

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) takes place each year for students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9 and has been an everyday part of the school calendar since 2008.

NAPLAN helps parents, carers and educators to see if children are meeting important numeracy and literacy standards.

### Collection of personal information

Schools are required by law to collect personal information about you and your child, irrespective of whether your child participates in NAPLAN testing.

The purpose of this notice is to advise parents and carers of how your child's personal information will be used for NAPLAN testing (both online and paper tests) in 2022 and, as part of NAPLAN Online, readiness activities scheduled at various times leading up to the test in May 2022.

### NAPLAN testing

Since its introduction in 2008, NAPLAN testing has been conducted using paper-based tests for students in all year levels. NAPLAN paper tests are administered every year across a 3-day test window in the second full week of May.

In July 2013, Australian education ministers agreed to guiding principles for national online assessment. The move to NAPLAN Online started in 2018. Moving online means NAPLAN is transitioning from paper-based tests to computer-based assessments.

Online testing brings many benefits and opportunities including providing better assessment, more precise results and faster turnaround of information.

Schools in South Australia will conduct NAPLAN testing online in 2022.

### Readiness testing activities

A critical step in preparing for NAPLAN Online is schools' participation in readiness testing activities.

The purpose of readiness testing activities is to ensure your child is familiar with their device and the online test environment, as well as to test school and national infrastructure systems and processes.

Readiness testing is not another NAPLAN and will not formally assess students who participate in the test. Any reports generated will be used for testing purposes only. Readiness testing activities may involve students who are participating in NAPLAN in 2022.

### Disclosure of personal information

For every student participating in NAPLAN Online testing and readiness activities, personal information will be uploaded by the Department for Education, as the Test Administration Authority (TAA), to the NAPLAN Online Assessment Platform ('assessment platform'). This information is listed over the page.

The information below marked with an asterisk (\*) is also provided by the department, as the TAA, to FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd for the purposes of printing paper test materials and reporting student results. FUJIFILM Data Management Solutions Pty Ltd ("FUJIFILM") is subject to rigorous information privacy and data security obligations under its contract with the Department for Education and is only

permitted access to personal information from a relevant school for the purposes of providing the contracted services.

The online assessment platform has been designed to comply with relevant national data security policies and guidelines, as well as data encryption standards.

The assessment platform is managed by Education Services Australia (ESA). ESA is a not-for-profit company jointly owned by the Australian education ministers. ESA is subject to rigorous information privacy and data security obligations under its contract with the Department for Education.

ESA only has access to personal information from a relevant school, TAA or the Australian schools list for the primary purpose of fulfilling ESA's role in supporting the operation of the assessment platform.

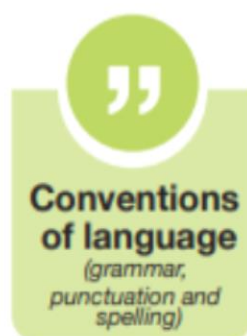
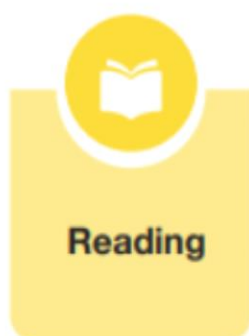

# NAPLAN – information for parents and carers

- NAPLAN is the name of some literacy and numeracy tests completed by students in Australia.
- All students do NAPLAN tests when they are in Year 3, 5, 7 and 9.
- Students are tested in English about their knowledge in reading, writing and maths.
- The test questions are presented in Standard Australian English dialect.
- Some of the questions are written and some of the questions are spoken.
- The tests will get easier or harder, depending on how students are going.
- Students do four different tests during two weeks in May each year.

## The names of the four tests are:

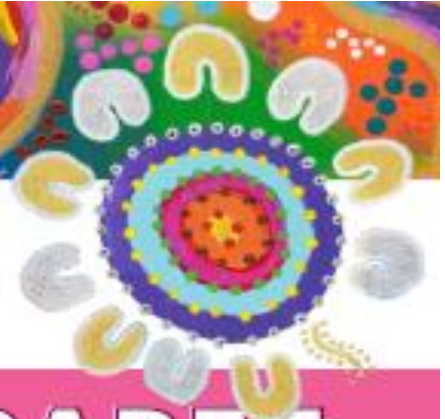


- Students in Year 3 will do the Writing test using pencil and paper. Year 3 students will answer the other test questions on the computer.
- Students in Years 5, 7 and 9 will answer all their test questions on computers.
- Teachers will help students get ready for NAPLAN tests.
- After getting the results back in Term 3, schools will give parents and carers a report showing how their child did.
- Parents and carers can talk to the teacher about these results.
- The information from the NAPLAN tests is used by people working in the Australian Government, your state or territory education authority and the school to find out how students are going all over Australia. It lets them see which schools are doing well and which schools might need help.

**Talk to the teacher if you are worried about your child being able to do the tests.**
